EARLY YEARS: St Francis of Assisi



St Francis of Assisi is very close to our school as we are a member of the <u>St Francis of Assisi Catholic Academy</u> <u>Trust.</u>

St Francis is known for his ministry to the poor and the sick, his care for nature and animals, and founding the Franciscan order.

"Lord, make me an instrument of your peace: where there is hatred, let me sow love; where there is injury, pardon; where there is doubt, faith; where there is despair, hope; where there is darkness, light; where there is sadness, joy."

YEAR ONE / TWO: Mother Teresa of Calcutta

Mother Teresa is mostly known for her charitable work. She spent her entire life dedicated to helping others. One of her many charitable efforts was setting up an open-air school and a home for the dying destitute. Mother Teresa founded the Order of the Missionaries of Charity, a Roman Catholic congregation of women dedicated to the poor, particularly to those in India, that opened numerous centres serving the blind, the aged, and the disabled.

YEAR THREE / FOUR: St. Josephine Bakhita



Kidnapped by slave traders at the age of seven, **St Josephine** was given the name: Bakhita, which means "lucky". As a girl, Bakhita would look up at the moon and stars, resolving to serve their Master. Later in life, she devoted herself to promoting Catholic missions to Africa. She died in 1947 in Italy.

Josephine Bakhita's life is remarkable, and presents us with spiritual lessons, namely her profound trust in God, despite living in a hopeless situation.

YEAR FIVE / SIX: St Thomas of Canterbury

St Thomas Becket, also known as St Thomas of Canterbury, served as Lord Chancellor from 1155 to 1162, and then notably as Archbishop of Canterbury from 1162 until his death in 1170. He engaged in conflict with Henry II, King of England, over the rights of the Church, and was murdered by followers of the King in Canterbury Cathedral. Soon after his death he was canonized by Pope Alexander III. He is venerated as a saint and a martyr by the Catholic Church and the Anglican Communion.

School Car Park and Parking in general:

We have a post and chain barrier to prevent people walking across the school car park. Please be reminded that:

- Access to the school for those on foot is via the steps by the road
- Access to the school for those with pushchairs, wheelchairs, scooters and bikes is via
 the ramp and the perimeter of the car park. Do not under any circumstances cut
 through the middle of the car park. This is a serious risk and we have had
 several near miss incidents
- The car park is for staff and visitors only. We have a disabled bay which can be used with our prior agreement
- Please refrain from bringing dogs onto the premises, this is a health and safety risk
- Please park sensibly and courteously along the road when dropping off and collecting

At this meeting the Governors reviewed the formal plans for the academic year presented by the school. These plans were very complete, both academically and also from a child development perspective.


The school operates under the umbrella of the Trust, which has updated all of its guidance over the summer holidays. The Trust provides the school with an
