

Dear Parents,

Welcome back to the spring term, we look forward to another successful term ahead. I would like to take this opportunity on behalf of the staff and myself to thank you for the many cards and gifts the we received at Christmas.

Survey Feedback

Many positive responses were identified through analysis of our recent Trust-wide pupil and parent surveys (undertaken in October 2023), the headlines and actions are summarised below:

Pupil Survey (82 respondents)

- 100% of pupils enjoy school
- 96% of pupils said they felt safe (remaining 3 pupils said there wasn't anything that made them feel unsafe)
- 98% of pupils said bullying doesn't happen
- 99% of pupils shared that the school encourages them to respect people from other backgrounds and treat everyone equally

PSHE Pupil Voice Objective: Who can I share my worries with? A small number of children were unsure about who they could share their worries with. As a result, the whole school have worked on their 'network hands' of five key people they can talk to if they have a worry. The School Council are also relaunching the class 'worry monsters'.

Parent Survey (34 respondents)

- 94% of parents surveyed said their child was happy and safe in school
- 97% of parents said the school helps their child to behave respectfully
- 94% said the school is well led and managed and has high expectations for their child

Parent Voice Objective: to develop further communication with parents on children's progress and how best parents can support with their child's learning. Each class teacher will give a weekly summary of the week's curriculum learning focus via Seesaw or Tapestry and we are planning a summer term parent Maths workshop to clarify key aspects of the maths curriculum.

Section 48 RE Inspection

As you are aware on Monday, the school received notification of a two day Section 48 RE Inspection on Wednesday 31st January and Thursday 1st February. You are invited to complete the <u>Parent Survey</u> by Thursday lunchtime, thank you - your feedback is important to us. We will update the outcome of the Inspection in due course.

Racial Justice, Equality and Diversity

This week, we have been exploring racial justice in both key stage and whole school acts of worship. All pupils completed a reflection and added

their thumbprint to postcards produced and co-ordinated by St Mary's, Bishops Stortford. This comes from the idea that each child in our care is a unique thumbprint of God. The postcards will become a piece of a huge collage at St Mary's that will spell out 'Imago Dei' (Image of God).

This is just a small part of the work we have started on racial justice, equality and diversity. As a school we have pledged to make our curriculum more representative of the community we serve and will soon be sending a short survey asking families for ideas about



how we can best represent the cultures and traditions of the St Thomas of Canterbury family.

Catholic Social Teaching



This half term our Catholic Social Teaching focus is 'Solidarity and Peace'. Solidarity is a word which can be overused and little understood. However, it is fundamental to the way in which we treat one another. If we truly believe that we are all sisters and brothers of one another, made in God's image and likeness as seen in the guideline of human dignity, then seeking the good of one another cannot be ignored. Solidarity is not just feeling sorry for those who suffer. It is a commitment to action. "We are all really responsible for all" – all of us. Wherever we are. Whatever our age. Whatever our circumstances. We are all responsible for one another, those close by, and those far away. All of our actions have consequences locally and globally. From how we treat people we meet in the street, to the coffee we buy in the supermarket. God has created us to live peacefully with one another. Triumphant Thomas Tigers Through to Next Round!




Sportshall Athetics

Bishop's Message for Racial Justice Sunday: 28 January 2024

Bishop Paul McAleenan, Lead Bishop for Racial Justice, offers a short message for Racial Justice Sunday. This year's day is celebrated in England and Wales on Sunday, 28 January 2024. Bishop Paul explains the theme and offers Catholics suggestions to mark the day.

"Hello. My name is Bishop Paul McAleenan. The theme of Racial Justice Sunday in England and Wales in 2024 is 'Seeing one another in the life of the Church'. There are different ways that the theme could be approached. I would like to suggest one particular way.

In the history of the Church, there have been those who looked at the society in which they lived, and responded to what they saw. They looked, made a decision based on what they saw, and acted. Alert and sensitive as they were to the commandments of Christ, when they saw justice being denied to someone because of their racial origin or colour, they were prompted to act. Their actions of opposing racism, promoting equality and justice, became their life's work. Following this path, sometimes they encountered hostility, rejection, and attempts to overturn what they were doing. However, they persevered and became instruments of change, agents of progress, and some are acknowledged as saints of the Church. There are many, many saints in the Church. Each is different. Each chose to follow a particular aspect of the person of Jesus".

God of our past, present and future, you created each one of us in your image and likeness, help us to recognise you in each person.

As we pray for end to suffering caused by racism lead us this day to walk with one another, pray with one another and work together, so that we create a future based on justice and healing, where all can fulfil the hope you have for all peoples.

We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.
